

MVHP Celebrates its 23rd Anniversary

The Merrimack Valley Housing Partnership celebrated its 23rd anniversary at The Whistler House Museum of Art in Lowell.

We were thrilled to have Congresswoman Niki Tsongas as our guest speaker. Niki spoke about the steps being taken to address the housing crisis. She explained the \$8,000 tax credit which serves as an incentive for first time home buyers. After discussing the importance of home ownership, Niki answered several questions from the audience in topics ranging from the situation in Afghanistan to the complicated process of enacting legislation.

We closed the program with Meghan McAnespie reading her award winning essay on "What My Home Means to Me". Meghan, a Lowell sixth grade student, was the grand prize winner in a city wide essay contest with over 250 entries.



From the Director

This is a challenging and rewarding time for us. During the past few years, we have aggressively taught our program participants how to identify bad loans and to steer clear of predatory lenders. These efforts have been fruitful as evidenced by the lack of our graduates finding themselves in trouble with their mortgages. I think that one of the biggest unreported stories during this housing and economic

downturn is the positive impact that the home buyer education field has had in reducing the size of the problem.

The damage is done and the tides have turned. Now, home buyers face much improved yet complicated market conditions. Prices are down. Interest rates are low. There is plenty of inventory. However, many buyers must contend with purchasing foreclosed properties or "short sales". Sellers who are "under water" owe their lenders more than their properties are worth. These short sales take an extraordinary amount of effort and time to complete. As the lenders, attorneys and real estate brokers can attest, most transactions are tedious and difficult.

Signs of recovery are evident. Like our fellow home buyer educators, we are experiencing a sizable increase in demand for our courses. First time home buyers sense that the time is right for them. The \$8,000 tax credit for first time home buyers is proving to be a highly effective incentive. Buyers must close on their properties before December 1st in order to take advantage of the credit. As a result, we are educating 100 + families each month in our classes in English, Spanish and Khmer.

The collaborations we share are the key to our success. We are grateful to the dozens of lenders, attorneys, home inspectors and real estate brokers who volunteer their time and talents to help teach our classes. Our partnership with the Cambodian Mutual Assistance Association has allowed us to better reach the Khmer speaking population. Our long associations with the City of Lowell, the Lowell Development & Financial Corporation and the State of Massachusetts have enabled us to provide down payment assistance to hundreds of new home owners.

Our bilingual staff, consisting of Maria Lopez, Ivette Santiago and Ed Alcantara, is dedicated, compassionate and talented. We are able to provide individual financial and credit counseling to our graduates as well as landlord/tenant training. Paul Krenitsky continues his volunteer efforts in fund raising and we are most appreciative.

As always, we are enormously grateful to the individuals and organizations that

provide financial support. Thank you.



Project Genesis Home Buyer Training Classes

Over 11,000 families have completed our home buyer training classes so far. We appreciate the dozens of real estate professionals who volunteer to help teach the classes each year. We strive to keep the classes vibrant and relevant by continually updating materials and presentations to reflect current market conditions.

Each year, we conduct 22 sets of seminars in English, Spanish and Khmer. Each series consists of 10 hours of instruction. Our English classes are held over four evenings at Middlesex Community College. On Saturdays, we conduct classes in Spanish at our offices located in downtown Lowell. We partner with the Cambodian Mutual Assistance Association to produce classes in Khmer.


